Strategy: Accessible Literacy—Reading

# Audience: Kindergarten to Grade 12

## What:

- Adapted literacy materials for emergent/non-readers
- Interactive materials for increased student engagement
- Online tools for promoting early literacy development

#### How:

 Supporting student literacy by using visual supports and simplified text

#### Materials:

- <u>Boom Learning</u>: search for interactive/adapted books
- <u>Adapt4SpecialEd</u>: digital and print based books for emergent readers on a variety of topics
- Epic Books: text to speech
- <u>Tar Heel Reader</u>: high interest/low level readers, book creator, text to speech (shared online resource where any individual can upload created books. Can search by topic of interest. Teacher/parent should vet books prior to use)

## Example:

Book for Emergent Readers <u>I see...How Many? Color? What? Phone</u> <u>Adapted Book</u>

# **Inclusive Practices to Consider:**

- Consider students vision when selecting font size
- For non-readers/emergent readers, repetitive text is best
- Students with augmentative and alternative communication (AAC) devices can learn to read using their device for output
- This strategy supports emergent readers, students with autism spectrum disorder (ASD), students with intellectual disabilities, students who are non-verbal/minimally verbal, etc.
