Strategy: Sharing My Successes

Audience: Kindergarten to Grade 4

What:

 Students create an e-portfolio to celebrate and provide evidence of their successes

How:

- Teachers demonstrate the structure of the portfolio
- The class brainstorms what work samples could be placed in the portfolio. The teacher makes the list available for future reference
- Students, in collaboration with their teachers, select work samples for their portfolios
- Students share their portfolios with their class and with their families
