Strategy: Multiple Intelligences

Audience: Grades 5 to 12

What:

- Educate students about multiple intelligences and have them find out their own strengths to work towards self-understanding and advocacy in learning


How:

- Watch the video “How to Be Smarter—8 Types of Intelligence” with the class
- Discuss the 8 Multiple Intelligences
- Have students guess which intelligence is their personal strength
- Have students complete the quiz “Find Out About Your Multiple Intelligences” to identify the type of strengths they have
- Share results as a group, option to graph their results
- Discuss what the implications of each type of strength/intelligence might be (careers, school strengths, etc.)

- Video: How to Be Smarter—8 Types of Intelligence
- Quiz: Find Out About Your Multiple Intelligences

Inclusive Practices to Consider:

- Some students may need support with reading or extra time when filling out the survey
- Consider introducing topic one day, leaving the quiz for homework, and coming back together to discuss each profile a few days later
