Strategy: Virtual Gallery Walk

Audience: Kindergarten to Grade 8

What:

- Fosters opportunity for students to observe successful peers
- Helps students build evidence of success
- Celebrate success

How:

- While nearing completion of a digital group project, examine the work of other groups or individuals
- Provide students access to edit other groups' slides in order to:
 - insert comments
 - free write
 - highlight
 - insert emotional reactions using emojis
 - write in the chat box
- After examining all the other projects students regroup and develop their projects further using new ideas they have picked up

- A synchronous online learning platform

Inclusive Practices to Consider:

- Research shows that alternatives to traditional written tasks enable students to use their learning strengths rather than their deficits
- In addition, multiple response options, the use of technology, and alternatives for student responses increase participation and engagement (Katz & Mirenda, 2002)
